

California's AI Law: A Transparency First Approach to Human-Centered Governance

In late September 2025, California enacted one of the most consequential state-level AI regulations to date with the passage of the Transparency in Frontier Artificial Intelligence Act (SB 53). The law establishes a transparency- and safety-focused framework for developers of advanced or “frontier” AI systems, signaling California’s intent to balance innovation with public accountability.

Under SB 53, frontier AI developers are required to publish detailed transparency reports and safety frameworks explaining how they identify, evaluate, and mitigate serious or catastrophic risks associated with their models. These requirements reflect growing concern that increasingly powerful AI systems can produce large-scale societal harm if governance mechanisms are absent or opaque.

The law also includes mandatory reporting of critical safety incidents, establishes oversight coordination with state emergency authorities, and provides whistleblower protections for employees who surface AI-related risk concerns. Importantly, SB 53 focuses its most stringent obligations on large-scale developers that exceed defined computational and revenue thresholds, while still requiring baseline disclosures across the frontier AI ecosystem.

California’s approach emphasizes trust through visibility, asserting that systems capable of shaping economies, information flows, and human opportunity must be transparent about their safeguards. As other states consider similar actions, SB 53 is widely viewed as a regulatory precedent that could influence the future of AI governance in the United States.

This is where alignment matters.

A human-aligned framework allows innovation to move forward while reducing the need for heavy, fragmented enforcement. It gives policymakers, companies, and communities a common language—before harm forces intervention.

The Human-Alignment Index was designed for precisely this moment: not to replace regulation, but to reduce the need for it by aligning systems with human values from the start.
